THE RED LETTER CHALLENGE:

In many of our Bibles, when we read the words of Jesus (that is, the words that He said while He was here on Earth in the flesh, as recorded in the four Gospels), they are often colored red. The idea for the Red Letter Challenge came from that color. What if we took those words of Jesus - the ones He says in red - and put them into practice? The Red Letter Challenge is unique because it takes Christ's literal words and gives you practical daily challenges based on those words.
